Dear Parents,

St. Charles School has a long-standing tradition of middle school floor hockey. It is a very short action-packed season between the winter and spring sports. Many elementary students enjoy being spectators for some of the games.

A safe and fun floor hockey tournament requires your cooperation. If your child is in grades K-2, you are responsible for providing or arranging supervision for him/her during the tournament. If your child is in grades 3 or 4, please make sure they understand the expectations of conduct as explained below. Students need to stay in the gym unless with an adult buying concessions. We recommend providing parent supervision for all students attending. **A student will only be released to the gym if their homeroom teacher has a signed copy of the following permission slip.**

All students must be picked up by 4:30 PM (3:45 on March 22).
