Dear St. Charles Parents,

On our first day of school, we were blessed with perfect weather, and we had the chance to gather in the church for a prayer service; what a great way to begin the school year! We prayed together with our pastor, Fr. Przybilla, and heard the Gospel reading that is our theme for this school year. The reading is John 6:48-51: "I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." You'll hear this verse, and more about this theme, at Family Formation nights and other times throughout the year.

Please make sure the **Parent Information Night** is on your calendar for one week from today. The evening will begin at 6:30 PM for K-4 Parents only. There will be grade-level presentations from the teachers from 6:30 PM to 6:50 PM and then a repeat of the same presentations beginning at 7:00 PM until 7:20 PM. We do this for families who have more than one child in grades K-4. If you only have one child in K-4, you only need to arrive for the 7:00 PM presentation. At 7:30 PM, I will be leading an all-school presentation in the school cafeteria; this will go until about 7:55 PM. At that point, we will break for about 5 minutes, and then the middle school team will take over presenting to the middle school parents in the cafeteria. Parents who do not have middle school students may depart after the all-school presentation. We hope to have this evening complete before 8:45 PM. For parents with multiple children in elementary and middle school, this is a long evening, but it is an important one.

We are laying the groundwork for the year ahead, and we are asking for your partnership by being with us for the evening!

This **Sunday, September 8th**, our parish is hosting a **Parish & School Celebration!** The 10:00 Mass will include our teachers, school staff, and parish staff taking the Oath of Fidelity and making a Profession of Faith. After Mass, there will be food, drinks, some sort of dessert, and hundreds of friendly faces. This is a great social gathering that I hope you can attend. If you are new to the parish or school this is a great way to meet new people!

Tomorrow, we have our first K-8l Mass of the year at 8:00 AM. I'm so glad we get to end our first school week in church together celebrating the Mass. This will not be a Mass with music, that will be the last Mass of each month (unless there is a conflict). Masses with music are indicated on the calendar on our website (https://www.stchbschool.org/for-parents/calendar/).

Just a note on the pick-up line. Please enter the pick-up line by turning onto Roosevelt from 27th. This helps with order to have everyone use the same entry point, and then we only back up traffic onto Roosevelt. Please do not enter from Pahl.

The first day the pick-up line took 14 minutes to complete, and the second day it only took 8! We do have soccer and volleyball to thank for some of that, but the efficiency really picked up! We have a pick-up line so that all of the students use the same process that is safe. When parents start coming up with their own processes for picking up, it compromises safety. Please use the pick-up process if you are picking your students up. My name is Mr. Kieffer, and I endorse the pick-up line. There are those who like to arrive at 2:30 or earlier to start lining up. If you want to move through the line very quickly, try to show up at 2:45 or 2:48.

Our school has a bus zone on Stinson, and it is important that we don't park or stop in the bus zone for any reason during arrival and dismissal. Please follow the law, make our bus drivers' lives easier, and stay clear of the bus zone.

Next week, we will be doing our first emergency response drills, including fire and lockdown drills. We do our best to make these drills effective and important while keeping the students from becoming overly concerned or alarmed.

Please mark your calendars for October 3rd at 6:45 PM! We are having an event designed to help our parents manage screens in their homes. The organization leading this workshop is called ScreenStrong. They are based in North Carolina, but they serve the entire U.S. Please see the attached flyer for more information and the QR code for registration below. The important thing today is to put this date into your family schedule so that at least one parent is available to attend. This is a battle we need to equip ourselves for, and we're much stronger if we do it as a community. Please plan to attend this event for our children.
